Ten years ago, domestic workers in the US weren’t even a statistic. The entire industry lurked beneath the nation’s consciousness – faceless and profoundly invisible. That all changed in December 2012 with the release of *Home Economics: The Invisible and Unregulated World of Domestic Work*, the first-ever nation wide account of conditions domestic workers face. 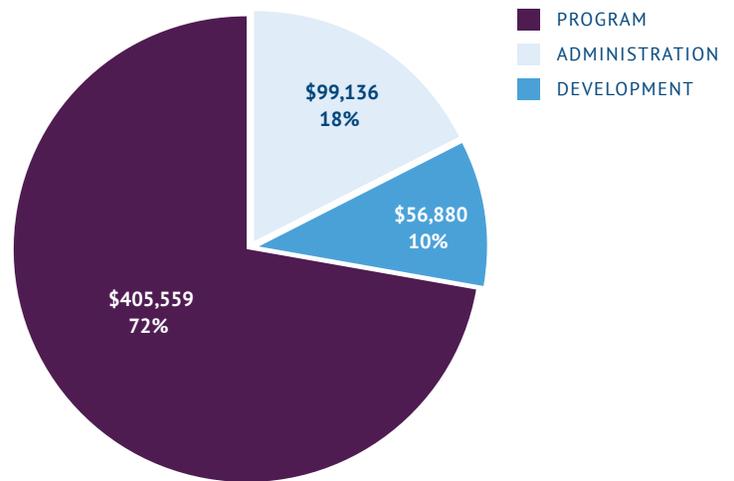
